### **GUIDES**

If anyone has any ideas for a Friday afternoon or Saturday night entertainment let me know.

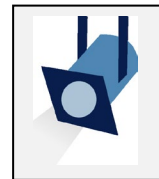
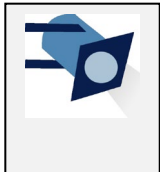
I think we can skip T&T this year. Most have been so far.

Hope to hear back asap. (A **\$200.00** deposit is needed to reserve a spot on this popular trip)

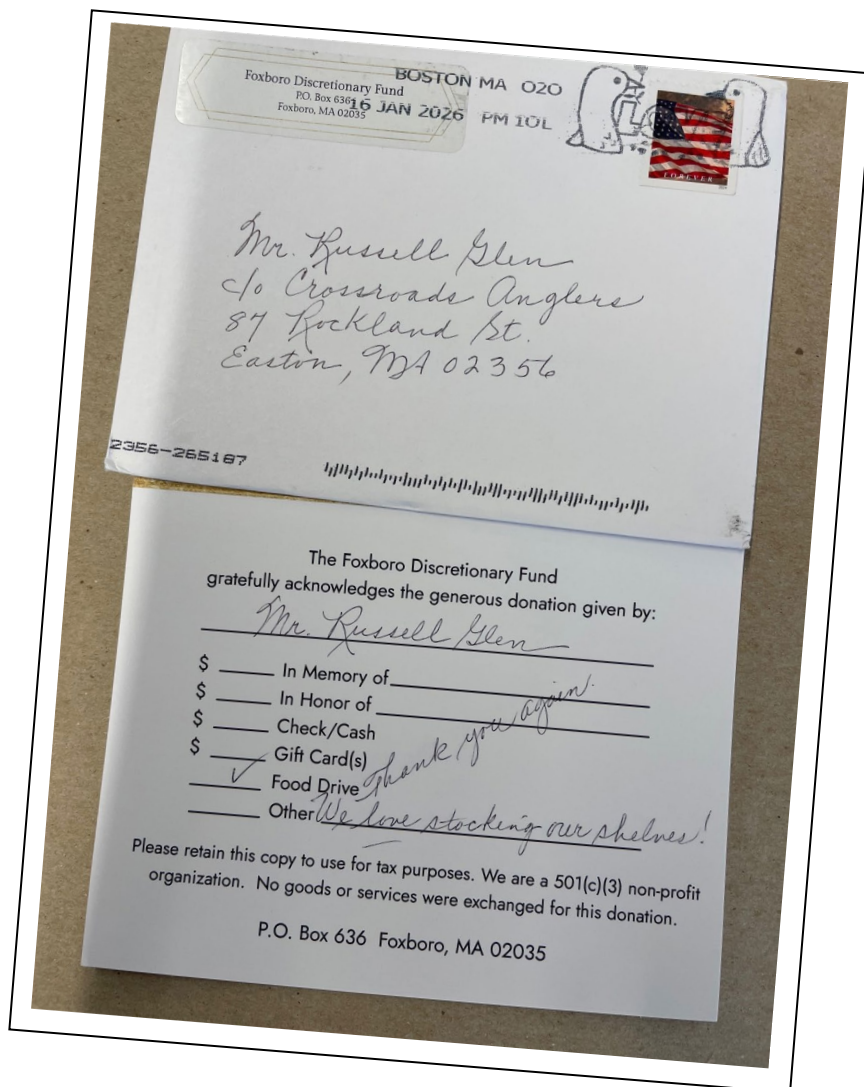

### CROSSROADS ANGLERS - Newsletter Submission - Recipes / Fish - Squid Ink Pasta

As a follow up to last month's column, I gave the squid ink pasta recipe a try at home. I found several varieties at 'Eataly' in Boston over the holidays, including pasta made with either cuttlefish or squid ink. I selected the squid ink spaghetti, and prepared a simple dish using fillet of sole.



#### SQUID-INK PASTA

- 1/3 package of squid-ink spaghetti
- boil in water until softened to al-dente
- drain using colander and return pasta to saucepan
- add butter and stir to coat pasta while on low heat



#### FILLET OF SOLE

- season fish fillets with Old Bay and Dill, refrigerate 2+ hrs or overnite
- Sautee over medium heat in Olive Oil, mix in chopped garlic, capers and lemon juice
- Serve over warm pasta



...so delicious. The pasta was not too fishy tasting; rather it was earthy and subtle. Give it a try!
