I wanted to thank everyone for a great February meeting and welcome all the new people who attended, Ed Lombardo has a wealth of knowledge and delivered an engaging presentation. We are blessed to have people like Ed, Armand, Howie and so many more who are willing to share their love of fly fishing.

Thanks to Jake and Temple Fork rods for their help with the raffle.

Like most people I have a go to fly in trout fishing and it is the CDC Elk hair caddis created by Hans Weilenmann. He has a marvelous web site with thousands of patterns, tied by hundreds of flytier's , I visit it often the address is <a href="http://www.danica.com/flytier/index.html">http://www.danica.com/flytier/index.html</a>.

I like the CDC elk hair caddis fly for several reasons. Chief among them is Hans use of the CDC feather as it adds life to the fly and in my experience it will out fish a standard elk hair caddis fly. Everyone loves to fish dry flies and the biggest thrill of all is seeing a trout come up and take a dry fly. However, if you want to catch more fish, you need to start fishing sub surface, this is the area that trout feed most of the time. Start thinking outside the box. I start out fishing the CDC elk hair caddis on a sink tip line it works as a normal dry fly for twenty to thirty seconds and by the time the fly line has pulled the fly down into the water column it can be fished as a nymph. I probable take three fish subsurface for every fish I take on top. The hornburg is also a great fly that can be fished this way. It won't be long before the ice melts and we will be back on the water.
